RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Review the plans, specifications, and engineer's estimate for the Apple Valley South Safe Routes to School Project, and authorize staff to proceed with the project.

BACKGROUND:

The Town of Apple Valley received a \$3,470,000 Active Transportation Program grant to design and construct improvements to enhance access to the Mariana Academy, the Sandia Academy, and Apple Valley High School. Improvements include street widening, curb and gutters, sidewalks, ADA ramps, and high visibility crosswalks. In addition, the Class I bike path connecting Apple Valley High School to Tussing Ranch Road and from Navajo Road to Mendel Road will be reconstructed. On March 27, 2018, The Town awarded a Professional Services Agreement to KOA Corporation to prepare the plans, specifications, and estimate for the project.

SUMMARY:

The projects plans, specifications, and engineer's estimate are complete, and the project is ready for construction. Prior to beginning the construction phase of the project, Caltrans requires acceptance of the plans, specifications, and engineer's estimate prepared by KOA Corporation. Once accepted by council and authorization has been received from the California Transportation Commission, a separate consent item will be submitted for authorization to advertise the project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact by authorizing staff to proceed with the plans, specifications, and engineer's estimate.
