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### RECOMMENDED ACTION

Award a contract to Layne for the Golf Course water pump and pump house, subject to "Approval as to Form" by the Town Attorney and "Approval as to Content" by the Town Manager.

### SUMMARY

Due to the fact that this project is a specialized type of service, a request for bids was sent out to 3 companies in the Southern California area that do this type of work. The Town received 2 bids for the subject project in response to the request for bids issued by the Public Works Department from August 1, 2019 to November 21, 2019.

After reviewing the submissions, staff concluded that Layne is the lowest responsible, responsive bidder.

## **BACKGROUND**

This project consists of providing necessary labor, equipment and materials to replace the existing pump and pump house, which provides irrigation water to the Apple Valley golf course. Currently the pump and pump house provides ground water for irrigation, but once non-potable water is available will be used to pump this for irrigation. The non-potable water will be collected at the ponds in the golf course from the Apple Valley Reclamation Facility, once it is fully operational.

This pump and pump house is original to the golf course and is very delapidated and in need of replacement. Ongoing maintenance of the existing pump has become a regular problem during peak use. In order to replace the pump, the system will have to be shut down for a period of time. Once this contract is awarded, work can commence during the winter season, when the course is not in need of continuous watering. Avoiding high watering months of the year is ideal for scheduling replacement.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

This capital project has been budgeted in the Golf Course Enterprise fund and includes a \$250,000 fair share contribution from Victor Valley Reclamation Authority (VWRA) for the use of the golf course ponds for the storage of non-potable water from the Apple Valley Reclamation Facility, owned and operated by VWRA.
