Subject: Four-way STOP sign installation at the intersection of Reata Road and Pimlico Road

Staff received a request to investigate the intersection of Reata Road and Pimlico Road to determine if a four-way stop is warranted. Currently there are STOP signs on the east and west legs of the intersection on Pimlico Road. The Traffic Committee previously reviewed this intersection in 2006.

Staff performed a traffic engineering investigation which included an evaluation of past records of vehicle conflict, traffic volumes, and a field review of the intersection. Four-way STOP controls may be warranted if 1) the total volume of the major approach legs of the intersection average 300 vehicles per hour for the peak eight hours and 2) that for the same eight hour period the minor approach legs average a total of 200 vehicles per hour. Currently the average is 181 vehicles per hour for the major legs and 138 vehicles per hour for the minor legs. While this volume is clearly less than the minimum normally required for a four-way stop warrant, it does indicate that there exists a balance of traffic on the major and minor approaches which is consistent with the 2/3 ratio required in the warrant.

State warrants also indicate that if 5 accidents occur in a 12 month period that may be susceptible to correction by placing additional stop signs, a four way stop may be justified. Between January 2005 and August 2008 there have not been any traffic collisions at this intersection.

Staff investigated for other contributing factors including surrounding geography, the potential for driver confusion, and intersection layout for clear sight views. The counts reveal that the traffic control currently in place at this intersection requires that the major leg stop, in conflict with normal two-way stop guidelines which require that the low volume approach be stopped. This may cause driver uncertainty if a motorist assumes the other approaches are required to stop. In addition, the zoning in this area changes abruptly between commercial on the southeast corner, and residential on the remaining corners, merging two differing trip generation rates. An existing retaining wall on the southeast corner minimizes visibility for drivers turning from northbound Reata Road onto eastbound Pimlico Road. Reata Road has a speed limit of 35 mph with 2 lanes of traffic in each direction. Pimlico Road has a speed limit of 35 mph with 2 lanes of traffic going eastbound and 1 lane of traffic going westbound.

In compliance with four-way stop guidance optional warrant D, "An intersection of two residential neighborhood collector (through) streets of similar design and operating characteristics where multiway stop control would improve traffic operational characteristics of the intersection", staff recommends that four-way STOP controls be installed to alleviate this potentially confusing situation and improve operational safety at this intersection.

Recommendation

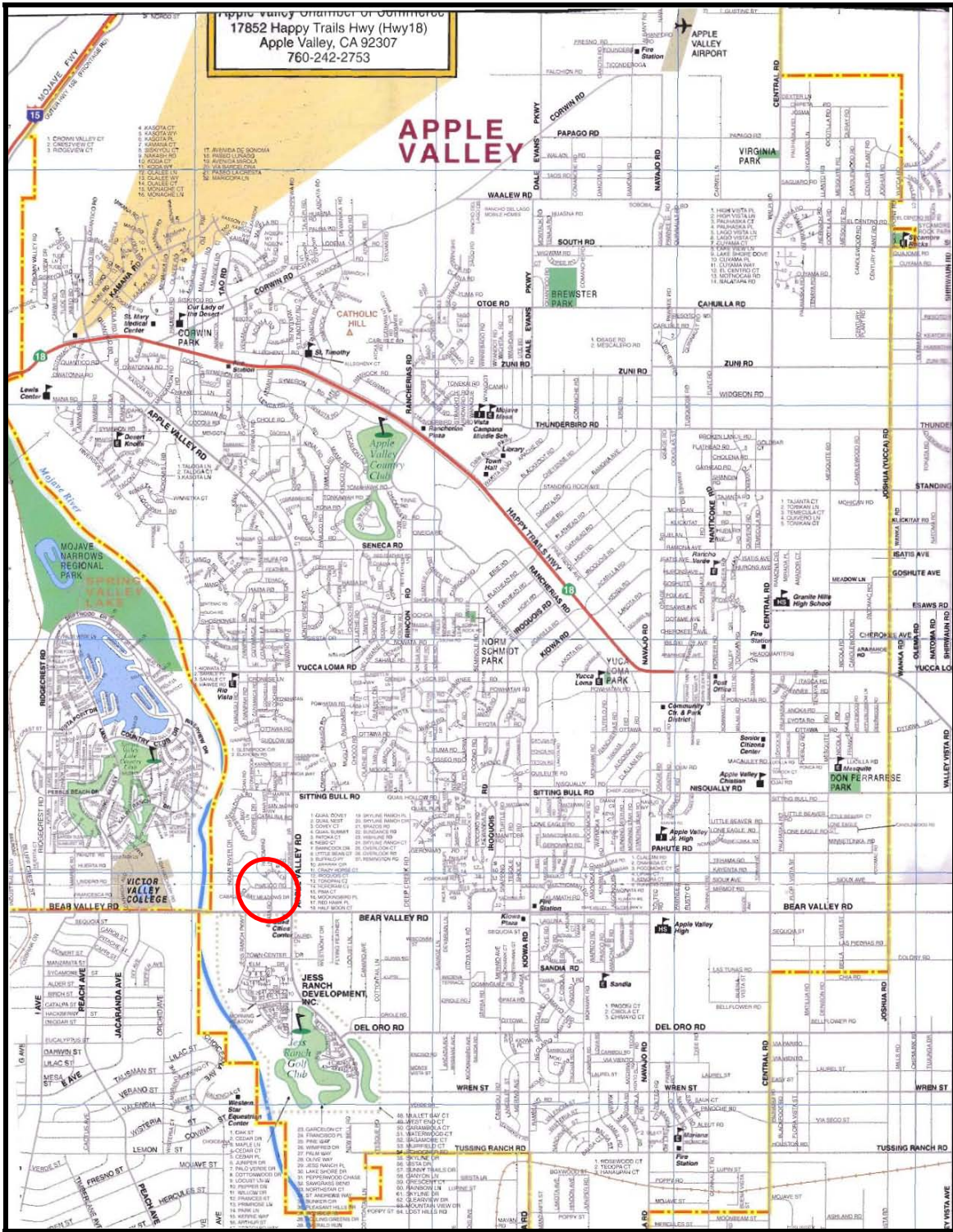
Staff recommends that four-way STOP controls be installed at the intersection of Reata Road and Pimlico Road.

TRAFFIC VOLUME ANALYSIS

RESOLUTION NO. 2008-65

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY ESTABLISHING THE INTERSECTION OF REATA ROAD AND PIMLICO ROAD AS A FOUR-WAY STOP INTERSECTION.

WHEREAS, a traffic engineering investigation has determined that establishing the intersection of Reata Road and Pimlico Road as a four-way STOP intersection is warranted in accordance with Section 52.0111 of the San Bernardino County Code as adopted by the Town of Apple Valley.

NOW THEREFORE, THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF APPLE VALLEY DOES RESOLVE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Approves and establishes the intersection of Reata Road and Pimlico Road as a four-way STOP intersection.

Section 2: Authorizes and directs the Town Manager to cause additional STOP signs to be placed on Reata Road and Pimlico Road.
